June is election of officers and board members. The only change from the current officers is Bill Needhan as president and Lowell Garret as Vice President. Board is adding Kim Perdomo as a member.

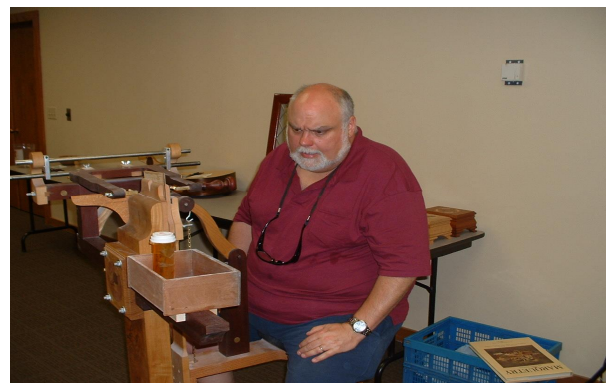
Here are the dates for selling raffle tickets for the yearly raffle.

Coming Event

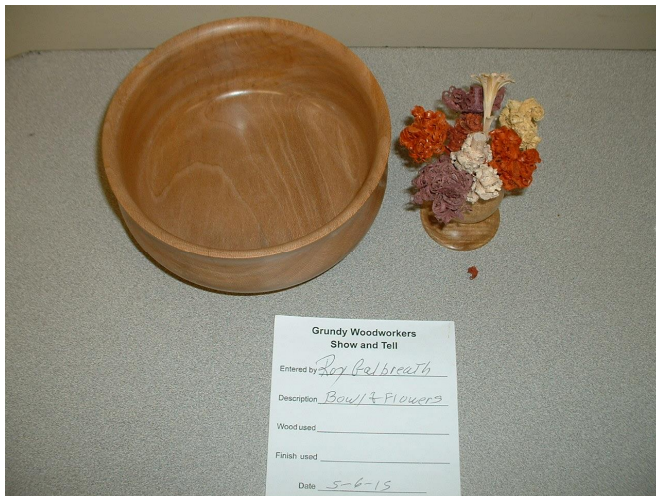
